- Open Researcher and Contributor Identifier
- ORCID iD is a 16-digit unique identifier
- Free to register and use your iD
- ORCID is used around the world by
  - Publishers
  - Research organizations
  - Funders

# How is ORCID different from other researcher identifiers?

### Funder ORCID iD requirements

Starting October 1, 2019, ORCID identifiers will be required by the National Institutes of Health (NIH), the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) for the following:

- Individuals supported by institutional research training, career development, and other research education awards.
- PD/PIs on individual fellowship and career development applications submitted for due dates on or after January 25, 2020.
- <u>applications will not be accepted</u> unless an ORCID iD is linked to the PD/PI's eRA Commons Personal Profile

## Funder ORCID req'ts continued

- Create ORCID link from Personal Profiles in the eRA Commons
- simplify the creation of biosketches for grant applications:
  - link ORCID with <u>SciENcv (Science Expert Network Curriculum Vitae)</u>



Sign in where you see the iD logo, for example:

- Submitting a manuscript
- Applying for a grant
- Depositing in a repository



## For admins: tracking publication information

- For departments using Activity Insight (CALS), ORCID is integrated, and tracking is already happening!
- For others, use Web of Science, select the Author Identifiers field from the main search screen and enter the ORCID number you want to track (video tutorial: <a href="https://youtu.be/MF9pvCHxQt8">https://youtu.be/MF9pvCHxQt8</a>)
  - Set up search alerts to get automatic notifications of new publications (video: https://youtu.be/JbYh n2tUpE)
